A Logo was agreed upon and grant applications were submitted to WDBC and DCC for the cost of badges, branded hoodies and to cover the cost of the first aid course.

**Town Council Grants** were awarded to the following not-for-profit groups and organisations at the November Policy & Resources Committee meeting. The value of grant applications far exceeded the budget available, and Councillors had to make some very difficult decisions, expressing how problematic it was and noting the vital role the groups and organisations played

within the community. The grant budget for this financial year has now been fully spend.

- Okehampton United Ecclesiastical Charity a grant of £500 towards the upkeep of St James' Chapel and the Town Clock for which Trustees were presented with a cheque by the Mayor.
- Okehampton District Community Transport Group a grant of £750 towards the provision and delivery of core services.
- Citizens Advice Torridge, North Mid and West Devon a grant of £4,000 towards provision and delivery of services.
- **Meldon Viaduct Trust** a grant of £250 to assist with funding of essential repairs and maintenance and build a reserve for refurbishment plans in 2029.
- **Everything Okehampton** a grant of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting, maintaining and dismantling the Christmas Lights.
- Okehampton Carnival a grant of £400 towards the running costs of the annual carnival
- Okehampton Ladies Friendship Group a grant of £342 towards the cost of room hire, refreshments for monthly meetings and for anniversary and Christmas celebrations



Details of how to apply for a grant in the next financial year can be obtained from the office or website.

**Town Centre Business Grant Initiative** - At the beginning of the financial year, the council put aside unspent funds amounting to £2,896 from the 2023/24 Grant budget to be used this year for a pilot scheme – a Town Centre Business Grant Initiative. This grant will enable businesses to apply for funding to spruce up their shop fronts which will improve the overall look of the town centre. WDBC have added to this grant pot by providing double the funds, increasing the amount available within the budget to £8,688.

This funding has to be spent within the next few months, so businesses are encouraged to apply for funding as soon as possible. Please see the council website for information.

The following grants were awarded at recent meetings of the Policy & Resources Committee.

- **Dogberry & Finch Books** a grant of £386.85 towards the cost of window decal, vinyl sign panels and an eco-friendly wall mounted heater.
- **The Arcade Trust** (Victorian Arcade) a grant of £1,500 towards the design and installation of a large entrance sign at the Fore Street end, refurbishment of the entrance panel the opposite end and repainting of associated entrance ceilings.

**Okehampton Library** The Cold Days, Warm Libraries campaign is back to warm up communities this winter. With the cost-of-living crisis continuing and a challenging winter ahead, we're reminding communities that libraries are warm, welcoming spaces with plenty going on beyond borrowing books. The campaign launched in October and runs until March 2025. Offering warm spaces, free Wi-Fi, computer access, friendly faces and somewhere to chat and connect with others - plus lots of fun activities for all ages.



### **Remembrance Sunday**

Participation in the Parade and Service at All Saints Church was bigger than ever this year, partially thanks to the weather which was kind. For the first time since before the Covid Pandemic a service was held inside the Church.

All those who attended and helped with arrangements are thanked for their ongoing support – this includes but is not limited to the Okehampton Excelsior Silver Band, Mace Bearers David Piper and David Ellis and those who help with the road closure.

## Arson – Bench Behind Lidl

In October 2023 a wheelchair accessible bench provided by the Town Council in the green space behind Lidl was deliberately set alight and destroyed.
